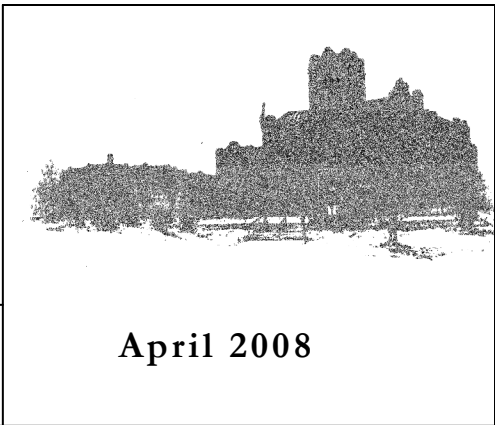

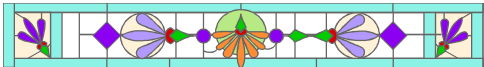

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

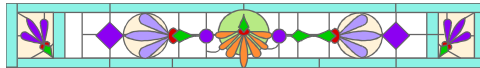

STANDARD OF DRESS

Central Collegiate is consistently striving to meet the educational, personal and social needs of our students. As an educational institution our primary objective is learning. In order to establish an environment that is supportive of our objectives, we must deal with issues that are disruptive towards meeting our objectives.

Our standard of dress policy is intended to offer clear guidelines as to what is acceptable in our school. Students should keep in mind that dress should be appropriate for a work place.

The following are guidelines for student dress:

- Clothing that reveals a person's midriff (front or back), cleavage or underwear garments is unacceptable.
- Shorts, skirts and dresses, including their slits, must not reach higher than the student's extended fingertips.
- Clothing with offensive language, pictures, designs or slogans including alcohol or drug symbols, or racist related wording are not acceptable.
- Students are not to wear hats in the school.
- Footwear is to be worn in the school.

Students are to maintain the above standard of dress while on school property during regular school hours. The school reserves the right to ask students to change clothing that does not meet the standards.
