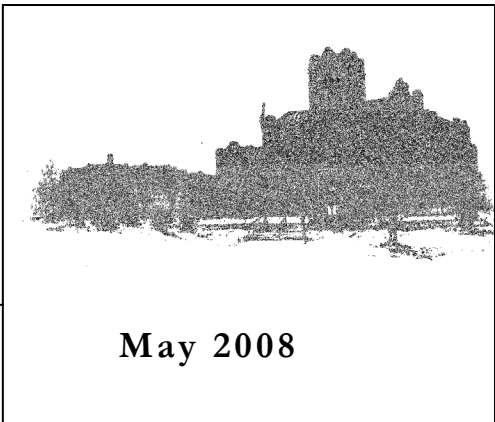

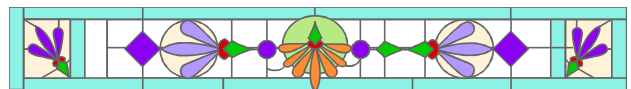
REPORT CARDS

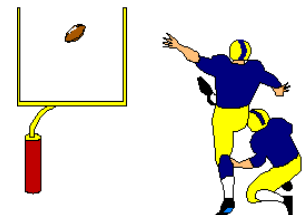
Central Collegiate Spring Music Concert
